#### **Project Description**

The project consists of the execution of investments over the Line D of the Buenos Aires Subway system including the acquisition of rolling stock, control signals and other equipment and the execution of some construction works with the goal of increasing the frequency of trains and improve the safety, quality and the overall capacity to serve the subway's demand. The outcomes of the investments plan over the Line D of the Subway is expected to: i) double the transportation capacity of Line D, to up to 30 services per hour to allow the Line D to transport approximately 650 thousands commuters ii) improve the quality of service (air conditioning, reduced travel times, reliability, internet access), iii) improve the efficiency and safety of the operation by improved performance and preventive maintenance.
