Project Description

Terminal Zarate is a port belonging to the Grupo Murchison. It has been designed as a port for the transfer of containers, general goods (except for fuel and hazardous substances), and vehicles (motor vehicles, trucks, and agricultural machinery).

Terminal Zarate has requested financial support from the Inter-American Investment Corporation (IIC) to extend the length of the existing pier 94 meters northward (it is now 385 meters long) and to purchase a new 80-ton capacity gantry crane.

The total project cost is estimated to be approximately USD 60 million. The financial plan is expected to be composed of an IIC and IDB A-loans and a B-Loan, with an 8-year tenor, including a principal grace period.
